1. Develop a study purpose/aim and question(s) relative to a contemporary, researchable nursing problem. 2. Draft a preliminary plan (quantitative or qualitative) to address a researchable question. 3. Enact select components of the research plan (e.g., literature review, collection of publicly available data, summary of clinical instruments) to yield a preliminary theoretical answer to the research question(s). 4. Interpret generated study findings and discuss theoretical implications for nursing practice. 5. Propose answer(s) to the research question(s) framed by the theoretical research activities undertaken. 6. Critique ethical dimensions within research activities.
