Students will practice locating topics and regulations in the Act, will master the definitions required to interpret Traffic Law and will apply the law, concerning Police authorities, driver's licences, permits and rules of the road. Students will practice completing provincial offence notices and will use them to testfy in mock court situations, according to professional requirements.
