#### **GENERAL OBJECTIVES:**

- to develop in the student a thorough understanding of the theory of Pitman Shorterhand through introductory or review procedures.
- to develop/increase the student's ability to read familiar/unfamiliar shorthand plate at an introductory speed
- to develop/increase the student's shorthand vocabulary including pacers an phrases.
- to develop/Increase the student's ability to write shorthand notes from unfamilar dictation and to transcribe MAILABLE letters at increasing rates of speed.
- to intensify the student's awareness of the relationship between shorthand and the correctly applied rules of English and typing formats (letters, memos, reports, etc.).

## **SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:**

By the completion of the first semester the student will be able to:

- read shorthand plate randomly selected by the instructor from  $n|\underline{p}^{\wedge}$  text with 100% accuracy at a minimum rate of 120 wpm on a piece of material
- write legible shorthand outlines from unfamilar dictation of a minimum of 100 words in length and transcribe on the typewriter a MAILABLE copy at the rate of 15 wpm.

- \*ljf student does not obtain a 75% average on theory tests but has successfully achieved the reading and transcription of the (4) required letters the student may request a comprehensive challenge exam on the theory portion of the grade.

  To receive credit for the theory portion of the evaluation the student must pass this challenge exam with 75%.
- 2. Theory tests will be combination of dictated vocabulary, short forms and phrases from current and previous chapters as well as two short paragraphs/letters. The dictated material must then be transcribed on the typewriter.
