CICE Modifications:	Preparation and Participation			
	 A Learning Specialist will attend class with the student(s) to assist with inclusion in the clasand to take notes. Students will receive support in and outside of the classroom (i.e. tutoring, assistance with homework and assignments, preparation for exams, tests and quizzes.) Study notes will be geared to test content and style which will match with modified learning outcomes. Although the Learning Specialist may not attend all classes with the student(s), support wi always be available. When the Learning Specialist does attend classes he/she will remain as inconspicuous as possible. Further modifications may be required as needed as the semester progresses based on individual student(s) abilities and must be discussed with and agreed upon by the instructor. B. Tests may be modified in the following ways: Tests, which require essay answers, may be modified to short answers. Short answer questions may be changed to multiple choice or the question may be simplified the abasic understanding. Tests, which use fill in the blank format, may be modified to include a few choices for each question, or a list of choices for all questions. This will allow the student to match or use visu clues. Tests will be written in CICE office with assistance from a Learning Specialist. The Learning Specialist may: Read the test question to the student. Paraphrase the test question to the student. Paraphrase the test question without revealing any key words or definitions. Transcribe the student's verbal answer. Tests length may be modified in the following ways: 			

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	 Assignments may be modified by reducing the amount of information required while maintaining general concepts. Some assignments may be eliminated depending on the number of assignments required in the particular course. The Learning Specialist may: Use a question/answer format instead of essay/research format Propose a reduction in the number of references required for an assignment Assist with groups to ensure that student comprehends his/her role within the group Require an extension on due dates due to the fact that some students may require additional time to process information Formally summarize articles and assigned readings to isolate main points for the student Use questioning techniques and paraphrasing to assist in student comprehension of an assignment E. Evaluation: Is reflective of modified learning outcomes.
