NATURE OF COURSE: Child Care Practice I will serve as an introductory course to the field of Child Care. The basic philosophy permeating this course is that there is a set of attitudes, specific knowledge, skills and proficiencies which are uniquely those of the competent Child Care Worker. We as a group will explore three central themes: the child, the setting, and the Child Care Worker.

GOALS & OBJECTIVES:

- a) To develop an awareness of the historical development of Child Care as a profession.
- b) To develop an understanding of the concept of emotional disturbance.
- c) To fully understand the 'variable' role of a Child Care Worker.
- d) To become aware of and learn to deal appropriately with the trauma of 'parent'/child separation.
- e) To develop an understanding of the concept of therapeutic management.
- f) To acquire a knowledge of the various child-care settings.
- g) To develop an understanding of the importance of and methods for establishing a relationship with a child.
- h) To develop child management skills in relation to the therapeutic milieu.
- i) To identify and comprehend those beginning skills essential to a Child Care Worker. (DACUM)

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- j) to recognize and deal appropriately with disruptive behaviour i.e. "tantrum".
- k) To learn the fundamentals of program planning.
- l) To learn the essentials of observation and recording skills.
- m) To rediscover the child through an understanding of some of the problems and solutions relative to development in the preschool child.
- n) To develop feelings and attitudes that will enhance the student's ability to think and act appropriately in the field.
- o) To encourage personal growth, particularly in the areas of self-awareness, self-acceptance, interpersonal skills, flexibility, initiative and tolerance for frustration.
- p) to promote skills in both verbal and non-verbal communication.

METHODOLOGY: The class will be taught through a combination of lectures, film presentation, student presentations, and group discussion. The format will vary in relation to content being presented.

 - article or clipping to be included and source identified as per A.P.A. (photocopy acceptable)
