#### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This field-based course will utilize a systematic approach to assess an individual's developmental level. The student will learn to assess, prescribe, train, evaluate and plan for use in program plans.

#### PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

- 1. To enhance the learner's development of the "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- 2. To provide a medium for development of skills for use in program planning.
- 3. To provide a system or method to facilitate the effectiveness of the M.R.C. student in instructional implementation and evaluation.

### METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

- 1. Regular attendance and participation in class.
- 2. Responsible for class notes and reading assignments as well as notes taken from films or videotapes.
- 3. Midterm and final exams will be given.
- 4. Individual conferences will be held and a grade will be arrived at.

#### METHODOLOGY:

- 1. Lectures: in which the instructor will discuss the concepts used in assessing the mentally handicapped.
- 2. Field-based instruction: in which the students will practice "learn by doing" approach.
- 3. Videotapes, films and articles: in which the student will be responsible for notes taken on the material presented.
- 4. Any other methods or materials deemed by the instructor to be necessary to enable the class and/or the individual student to reach the course objectives; for example, simulation exercises.

# COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1. The student will demonstrate the ability to assess, prescribe, plan, train and evaluate individual programs for the mentally handicapped.
- 2. The student will demonstrate competence in task analysis, positive reinforcement, charting, setting, and identifying performance objectives, skill levels, and focal points.
- 3. The student will demonstrate the ability to apply a systematic model to alternative assessment tools.
