This field-based course will utilize a systematic approach lo assess an individual's developmental level. The student will learn to assess, prescribe, train, evaluate and plan for use in program plans-

PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

- 1. To enhance the learner's developmentbf the "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- 2. To provide a medium for development of assessing skills (motor skills, self help skills, aquatic skills, movement ability, fitness, social skills) for use in program planning-
- 3. To provide a system or niethod to facilitate the effectiveness of the D.S-W. student in instructional implementation and evaluation-
