INTRO TO COMMUNITY SERVICES

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I. PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

This course is designed to introduce the student to the broad range of human services available in the community; the client's relationship to these services; and the workers role in these services. Government structure and legislation will be examined.

The primary goal of this course is to familiarize the student with the function and administrative structure of available social services and the legislation pertinent to the delivery of these services. Human relation skills and their importance to the helping professions will be emphasized. Local human service agencies will be reviewed.
