**PURPOSE OF COURSE**

This course will provide a forum in which the students can practice the skills that they have been taught and receive feedback on their level of development. The content will be designed to promote communication skills and relationship building. The course will be taught using an experiential learning model and will allow the student to examine, modify, and change their behaviors so that their individual technique and style will be helpful to those clients they wish to serve. The course can be viewed as a consolidation of related course content leading to refinement skills useful in working with Young Offenders.

**METHODOLOGY**

The class will be taught using the student's past experiences, (group dynamics), role plays, films, and the use of peer evaluation.

**COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

1. To actively participate in group discussions.
2. To complete, in groups of 3-4, a lesson using the experiential model. Topics to be discussed with instructor.
3. Eighty percent attendance is compulsory to pass the course.
4. Each student to prepare and deliver a peer evaluation on one other student.
5. Each student to present a self-portrait.
6. All students to participate in final grading.
7. All students to maintain a journal and share with instructor.
