COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This field-based course will utilize a systematic approach to assess an individual's developmental level. The student will learn to determine a student's present level of functioning and then design an individualized program.

PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

- To enhance the learner's development of the "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- To provide a medium for development of skills (motor skills, self help skills, aquatic skills, movement ability, fitness, social skills) for use in program planning.
- 3. To provide a system or method to facilitate the effectiveness of the D.S.W. student in instructional implementation and evaluation.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

- 1. Regular attendance and participation in class. (33 1/38)
- Responsible for class notes and reading assignments as well as notes taken from films or videotapes.
- 3. Midterm and final exams will be given. (66 2/3%)
- 4. Individual conferences will be held and a grade will be arrived at.

TEXTBOOK(S):

The Adaptive Behaviour Curriculum Volumes I and II, by Dorothy Popovich / Prescriptive Behaviour Analysis for Moderately, Severely, and Profroundly Handicapped Students.

METHODOLOGY:

- 1. Lectures: in which the instructor will discuss the concepts used in assessing the mentally handicapped.
- Field-based instruction: in which the students will practise "learn by doing approach".
- 3. Videotapes, films and texts: in which the student will be responsible for notes taken on the material presented.
- 4. Any other methods or materials deemed by the instructor to be necessary to enable the class and/or the individual student to reach the course objectives; for example, simulation exercises.
