COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to give the students an understanding of the unique needs of "Multiply Handicapped" individuals. The course will present the student with introductory skills in areas such as: Blissymbolics, sign language, blind mobility training, wheelchair lifting techniques, etc. The learning model will utilize hand-on-demonstration, as well as traditional classroom approach.

BEHAVIOURAL OBJECTIVES:

After completing the course each student should be able to:

- 1. Distinguish between a disability and a handicap.
- 2. Identify different types of handicaps and disabilities.
- 3. Access needs of a multiply-handicapped persons.
- 4. Demonstrate knowledge of safety requirements for specific multiply-handicapped persons.
- 5. The student will be able to recognize and apply (under professional supervision) certain therapies and techniques.
- 6. Recognize and deal with certain stereotyped behaviours characteristic to the multiply-handicapped.
- 7. Have basic knowledge and demonstrate various augmentative communication systems, i.e. sign language, blissymbolics, computer aids.
