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DSW 204-3 (COUNSELLING SKILLS) Course Outline Instructor: Ed Finn

PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

This course is designed to provide the student with an introduction to counselling for use with the developmentally handicapped on an individual and group basis.

- To develop in the learner the "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- 2. To enable the student to develop specific competencies in counselling the developmentally handicapped.
- 3. To enhance the learner's development of a feeling of self-worth.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

- 1. Regular attendance and participation in class. (33 1/3%)
- 2. Responsible for class notes and reading assignments as well as notes taken from films or videotapes.
- 3. Midterm and final exams will be given. (66 2/3%)
- Individual conferences will be held and a grade will be determined.

METHODOLOGY:

- Lectures: in which the instructor will discuss the concepts used in counselling.
- 2. Videotapes, films and audiotapes: in which the student will be responsible for notes taken on the material presented.
- Individual and group counselling experience: in which the student will participate in role playing, simulation, active listening and interviewing.

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COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- The student will identify the principles of mental health for use 1. in counselling.
- Identify the phases through which many parents of developmentally 2. handicapped children proceed as they adjust to the fact that their child is handicapped.
- The student will demonstrate the ability to listen, observe, 3. express and interview as it relates to counselling.
- The student will identify the difference between good and poor 4. counsellors.
- 5. The student will identify the qualities of a loving human being.

RELATED READINGS:

The student will choose a counselling related book to report on in class.
