PHILOSOPHY/GOALS

This course is designed to provide the student with an introduction to counselling for use with the developmentally handicapped on an individual and group basis.

- 1. To develop in the learner the "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- 2. To enable the student to develop specific competencies in counselling the developmentally handicapped.
- 3. To enhance the learner's development of a feeling of self-worth.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

- 1. Regular attendance and participation in class. (33 1/3%)
- 2. Responsible for class notes and reading assignments as well as notes taken from films or videotapes.
- 3. Mid-term and final exams will be given. (66 2/3%)
- 4. Individual conferences will be held and a grade will be determined.

TEXTBOOK:

METHODOLOGY:

- 1. Lectures in which the instructor will discuss the concepts used in counselling.
- Videotapes, films, and audiotapes in which the student will be responsible for notes taken on the material presented.
- Individual and group counselling experience in which the student will participate in role playing, simulation, active listening, and interviewing.

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COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- The student will identify the principles of mental health for use in counselling.
- 2. Identify the phases through which many parents of developmentally handicapped children proceed as they adjust to the fact that their child is handicapped.
- The student will demonstrate the ability to listen, observe, express, and interview as it relates to counselling.
- The student will identify the difference between good and poor counsellors.
- The student will identify the qualities of a loving human being.
