Philosophy/Goals

This is a course designed to give the student the functional skills necessary to interact with individuals with special needs, and assist them in participating in leisure pursuits.

Students will develop an understanding of "how to" provide leisure education/counselling, program planning, and implementation of recreation/leisure resources available.

Students will be asked to participate in various activities or placements.

Objectives:

Upon completion of this course the students will:

1. Students will learn what is recreation and leisure and the importance of it within the 24 hour a day plan.
2. Students will develop a resource library of recreational pursuits.
3. Students will learn how to adapt and analyze activities in order to individualize recreation for the special needs population.
4. Students will participate in ten hours of hands on experience, accompanied by assignments.

Methodology:

Course presentation will vary according to material presented.

Lecture, group discussion, work assignments, readings, and placements, will compose methods for course content.

Course Requirements:

1. To maintain regular attendance.
2. To participate actively in class discussion.
3. To complete assigned readings and projects.
4. To complete mid-term assignment, placement requirements, and final test on material covered.
