PHILOSOPHY:

This course will provide students with knowledge to develop and implement individual programs for people with special needs. The students will be introduced to terminology in behaviour modification for task analysis programs. The students will have a basic understanding of the assessment process and an individual program plan as related to developing an individual training program.
