ED 203 - HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY OF PRESCHOOL EDUCATION

In order to develop a useful educational perspective and philosophy pf preschool education for our time, the evolution of ideas about early childhood education in western civilization is traced, and relevant writings are examined.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is designed to give the student historical knowledge and understanding of the attitude toward children and their development and education, with a view to helping the student compare and evaluate some of the major contemporary programs and to develop a personal philosophy of preschool education.

COURSE GOALS

The students will:

- 1. Assess their own past learning experiences in relation to the influence of schools, books, teachers, peers, family, society, media, etc.
- 2. Examine the reasons why we need a philosophy of education.
- Acquire an historical perspective of child development views and practises and their influence on contemporary programs.
- Demonstrate a knowledge of the various major contemporary philosophies and the programs reflecting these approaches.
- Develop a personal philosophy of preschool education.
