COURSE DESCRIPTION

Both formal and informal methods of infant test measures and developmental assessment procedures will be reviewed. Symptoms of lag, deviation or handicap in areas of ability will be highlighted. Practical interpretation of planning individual programs and activities optimum development of infants and toddlers will be emphasized.

COURSE GOALS

- 1. The students will become familiar with a number of different assessment tools. They will know which assessment to administer and how to administer it and how to interpret the results.
- 2. The students will learn the details of setting up an Individual Program Plan, based on assessment results and the child's needs.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The student will be able to discuss and demonstrate through oral and written responses, an understanding of:

- Assessment tools, how the are designed, circuited, administered and interpreted.
- Informal methods of assessment and observation and how to interpret the results.
- Interpreting results from an assessment which indicates a developmental delay.
- 4. The components of an Individual Program Plan, and how one is designed for a child's specific needs.
- 5. Activities for children which would be of assistance in setting up an Individual Program Plan.

Through lectures, seminar presentations, readings and independent study.
