They will learn to analyze and convey important financial reports, becoming familiar. They will be subjected to performance evaluation, scorecards that measure a variety of outcomes. Students will be introduced to the funding and financial environments of Ontario health care organizations, as well as what affects them, eg. Industry standards, best practices, trends, and access.
