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PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM;

Non-registered nurses may also access this program upon recommendation from the College of Nurses of Ontario.

The program will contain a total of 240 hours. The theory content will be 90 hours and the lab and clinical experience will be 150 hours.

- 5. The learner will practice nursing within the scope of the privileges, responsibilities, ethical and legal obligations of the nursing profession as outlined in the current Standards of Nursing Practice of the College of Nurses of Ontario, 1987 and the Health Disciplines Act.
- 6. The learner will identify the relationship of the nursing profession to the health care system.
- 7. The learner will interact with other members of the health care team which may include the supervision and direction of other members of the nursing team.
- 8. The learner will assume responsibility for continuous personal and professional development.
