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UNIT 4 - THEORY

I. PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

Unit 4 examines the Nervous and Reproductive Systems. Conditions such as mental retardation, stroke, aphasia, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease, and lung disorders are studied. Spiritual needs of the client are examined as well as sexuality needs. The student will study how to care for the client who is dying. Preparation strategies for employment are also examined.

II. STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES;

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- 1) describe measures to meet the physical, psychosocial and spiritual needs of the client who is dying,
- describe the care for the client who has respiratory problems,
- identify measures to deal with the client who is angry, overly-aggressive or violent,
- 4) describe the concept of sexuality and the elderly,
- 5) relate the structure and function of the nervous and reproductive systems to mental retardation, stroke, aphasia, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease and sexually transmitted diseases, and
- 6) identify measures in seeking employment as a Health Care Aide.
