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COURSE NUMBER

I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Nursing concepts will examine aspects of the nursing profession that influence the practice of the registered practical nurse. The course will review the historical development of the registered practical nurse (RPN) with emphasis on the current issues and trends affecting nurses in Ontario. The role of the RPN and the professional organizations that influence his/her practice will be examined. The RPN Standards of Practice including relevant ethical and legal issues will be addressed. The student will also explore the health care environment in which nursing is practised with a focus on health care delivery systems.

II. LEARNING OUTCOMES (STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES):

Upon successful completion of this course the student will have:

- 1) Explored the current issues and trends in health care and their effect on the nursing profession.
- 2) Investigated the current roles of RPNs as members of the health care team.
- 3) Outlined the ethical and legal rights and responsibilities of RPNs as members of a self regulating profession.
- 4) Examined the nursing process as a component of nursing care.
- 5) Examined the organizational structures and delivery systems practised in health care settings today.
- 6) Contrasted the concepts of leadership and management.
- 7) Described the leadership opportunities for RPNs.
