Ends in View and Processes:	Ends in View The purpose of the nursing inquiry course is to provide the student with an opportunity to further			
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explore the process of inquiry in nursing practice. The focus of this course is on the profession of nursing and knowledge development for the profession. Through readings and discussions, the student will have an opportunity to critically examine the process of inquiry in nursing as a basis for evidence informed practice. Students will also have the opportunity to explore their own processes of knowing and engage as an active participant in the development of the growing body of knowledge in nursing.

Ends in View

Process

Praxis is the underlying process that will be used in the course. Critical reflection on self, values, ways of knowing, experience, context, and theory will be integrated. The intent is that students engage in an interactive process with the nursing literature and their own practice. Preparation, discussion, learning activities, and written exercises will be used. All students are expected to be active participants in the course. Evaluation of this is determined by attending and actively participating in scheduled classes, and providing ongoing and timely contributions within an on-line learning environment.
