OVERALL OBJECTIVES

- 1. Use Nursing Process to facilitate optimum adaptation for clients
- 2. Demonstrate the roles and responsibilities of members of the nursing and health care teams.
- 3. Communicate effectively with patients, personnel and others.
- 4. Provide appropriate direction and supervision for the R.N.A. and auxiliary personnel.
- 5. Assume responsibility for continued personal and professional growth.
- 6. Protect the dignity of clients.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

The student is expected to keep these objectives with her in the clinical area and maintain a current record of *when and how they have been met as indicated.

- I. USE THE NURSING PROCESS TO FACILITATE OPTIMUM ADAPTATION FOR CLIENTS.
- A. DEMONSTRATE INCREASING INDE-PENDENCE IN THE USE OF THE NURSING PROCESS WITH THE DIRECTION AND CO-OPERATION OF NURSING SERVICE PERSONNEL.
 - 1) Communicate more extensively with nursing service personnel than with clinical teacher.
 - 2) Seek guidance. Make nursing decisions based on principles and when uncertain, discuss with team leader.
 - 3) Prepare and lead patient centred conferences. At least one to be evaluated by clinical teacher or delegate.
 - 4) Be self directed in orientation to unit and obtaining relevant information about ward protocols and policies.
- B) ASSESS CLIENTS AT ANY POINT ON THE HEALTH-ILLNESS CONTINUUM.
 - Systemically gather a comprehensive, accurate and relevant data base.
 - 2) Analyze collected data based on adaptation framework and scientific knowledge base.
 - 3) Identify nursing diagnoses supported by A and B.

PLAN, ORGANIZE AND CARRY OUT NURSING CARE WITH EFFECTIVE USE OF TIME, EFFORT AND MATERIALS.

- 1) Assume responsibility for
 delivering of skilled
 nursing care for a number
 of patients requiring
 different levels of
 nursing intervention.
 Suggested expectation:
 6 patients
- 2) Plan and determine priorities of care for assigned patients and discuss with team leader as needed.
- 3) Be able to verbalize rationale for planning decisions.
- 4) Make nursing judgments based on changes in patient's condition or nursing needs and initiate action.
- 5) Keep patient care plans up to date and communicate changes to others involved
- 6) -Alter plans to cope with unanticipated events.
- 7) Respond appropriately in urgent situations.
- 8) Carry out safe, organized care for all clients.

- 9) Carry out safe preparation and administration of medications to a larger group of patients.
 - follow through on new medication orders and on discontinued medications
 - be familiar with emergency medications available on unit
 - share responsibility for correct narcotic count at beginning and end of tour of duty
- 10) Maintain medical and surgical asepsis at appropriate times.
- 11) Maintain comfort and dignity of clients.
- 12) Demonstrate increasing skill in nursing procedure
- 13) Record significant information accurately, systematically and according to policy.
- 14) Effectively meet the learning needs of clients.
- 15) Care for a patient being admitted, completing the total admission procedure and communicating with other departments as necessary.
- 16) Care for a patient being discharged, completing the total discharge procedure and communicating with other departments as necessary.
- D. EVALUATE NURSING CARE, AND REVISE, AS NECESSARY.

DEMONSTRATE THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS OF THE NURSING AND HEALTH CARE TEAMS.

- a) Work as an integral member of the nursing, team during each tour of duty.
- b) Observe the functions of the head nurse and accompany her when possible.
- c) Work with the team leader to become more familiar with her role.
- d) Work as a team leader, with assistance.
- e) Accompany the physician on patient visits.
- f) Communicate to the physician relevant information about patient's condition and receive written orders for changes in plan of care.
- g) Relate plan of nursing care to other health team members and integrate their care into total plan.
- h) Communicate with other health team members who are involved in patient care.
- i) Initiate appropriate referrals to health team members and community resources.

- 3. COMMUNICATE EFFECTIVELY WITH PATIENTS, PERSONNEL AND OTHERS
 - a) Continue to demonstrate effective IPR with patients and families.
 - b) Continually analyze and seek to improve interpersonal relations and communication skills.
 - c) Utilize appropriate channels of communication in nursing practice.
 - d) Be responsible for written requisitions for patient services and/or supplies to departments in the hospital-
 - e) Interact with personnel in other departments-
 - f) Assume responsibility for the effect of own behaviour on individuals and groups.

- 4. ASSUME LEADERSHIP ROLE WITHIN THE NURSING TEAM.
 - a) Delegate appropriate functions to team members.
 - b) Be able to verbalize rationale for decisions about delgation to team members.
 - c) Follow through with personnel to ensure that delegated functions have been carried out.
 - d) Give praise or suggestions for improvement as necessary when supervising personnel.

ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROFESSIONAL NURSE FOR CONTINUED PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL GROWTH.

- a) Assume accountability for own actions.
- b) Maintain competence.
- c) Set personal goals and objectives for consolidation and future nursing experience.
- d) Identify own learning needs and develop and implement plan to meet these needs, communicating with Team Leader, Head Nurse and/or teacher as necessary.
- e) Practice within legal framework.
- f) Assume responsibility for research re: diagnosis, pathology, treatments•
- g) Assume responsibility for ongoing self-evaluation.
- h) -Recognize and accept own limitations, requesting guidance and advice as necessary.
- i) Recognize and develop personal qualities which enhance own nursing practice.
- j) Adhere to professional requirements regarding attendance and grooming.
- k) Adhere to professional ethical requirements.

PROTECT THE DIGNITY OF THE CLIENTS.

- a) Base nursing care on respect for clients' rights.
- b) Provide nursing care based on clients' requirements as individuals,
- c) Involve clients in decisions about care.
- d) Protect the privacy of the client.
- e) Assume a client advocate role in nursing practice.
