This course gives Fourth semester students an opportunity to examine and discuss; the various functions of the mass media, and to investigate these functions through a major research project* Students will be responsible for choosing their own area of investigation Subject to the approval of the instructor.

Marks will be t?sed on a preliminary report, progress reports, and a final seminar and essay*

Throughout the semester students will be assigned readings which relate to the functions of the media, and the relationship of the ~fcs media and other ^"stit^tion?. These reading wijj provide the focus for class discussions*

(Note: During the current semester (Jan, - April, 1975) the research topics included: A comparison of the news coverage of the <u>Sault Daily Star</u> and the <u>Sudbury Star</u>; a comparison of the editorial policy of the <u>Sault Daily Star</u> and the <u>Sudbury Star</u>; a paper on Marshall McLuhan and his view of the electronic media; An investigation of the proposed changes in the Income Tax Act and the effect of these changes on <u>Time</u> and <u>Readers' Digest</u>; An investigation of the local cable TV dispute.)
