PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

The students will use the language lab equipment, workbooks, and specific exercises with guidance from the instructor. This course will enable students to acquire a substantial comprehension level in listening skills.

STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course, the students will demonstrate listening skills, be able to discern and discriminate words, sounds, meanings (e.g. homonyms) as well as demonstrate improved vocabulary, comprehension and pronunciation.

REQUIRED STUDENT RESOURCES:

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:

Teacher-directed work for individual and/or in small groups, class discussions, oral exercises, and working in audio-lab using selected tapes and worksheets, if possible, will be the bases of instruction.

NOTE: Individual student needs will always be considered; material to be presented accordingly.

TIME FRAME: This course involves two (2) hours per **week** (in-class instruction) plus one (1) hour of self-study for duration of one entire semester.
