PHILOSOPHY/GOALS

The student will develop language capabilities to an advanced level, depending upon entry level. Emphasis will be placed upon building from the grammatical foundation gained in ELT 100-6. Sentence patterns, vocabulary, and spelling will be stressed. Advanced level speaking, listening, and reading skills are major components of this course.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

Students will be assessed on the basis of homework, written assignments, reading comprehension tests, dictionary assignments, vocabulary and spelling tests.

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:

A variety of instructional methods will be employed. These will include small group and pair activities, self and teacher directed, videos, and games will be used to reinforce skills.

OBJECTIVES INCLUDE:

This course will permit students, depending upon entry level, to refine the speaking, listening, and reading skills learned in the first level of ELT.

1. The student will be able to communicate at a higher level with greater ease.

2. The student will be able to develop writing skills from the simple sentence construction to compound-complex sentences.
3. The student will begin the correct use of transitionals and be able to correctly construct a paragraph.

Students entering this course without the skills developed in ELT-100 will achieve a basis in speaking, listening, reading, and constructing grammatically correct writing skills that will be further developed in advanced courses.
