This course is designed to provide students with a knowledge of the basic structure of the Ojibway Language rather than producing fluent conversationalists. Some of the problems in reading and writing the language will be discussed.

GOALS: The goals of this course are to motivate/stimulate oral expression in Ojibway Language and to promote its use on a daily basis. The course will promote pride in one's own culture, as language is the basis of one's way of life. Students will acquire an understanding of their cultural heritage, thereby fostering pride and developing a positive self-image.

Objectives: The objectives of this course are to give the students the following opportunities:

- 1. to develop their learning skills pertinent to language study, practice and communication.
- 2. to use in their own conversations vocabulary and structures taught.
- 3. to understand and appreciate the cultural points expressed in the Native language.

TEXTS: There are no required texts for this course. However, booklets are presently being prepared and will be made available for reference material.
