**PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:**

This course will provide the student with the ability to understand organization, main ideas, and inference as well as extending vocabulary and comprehension of written material. Specific attention will be given to short stories and technical materials to enable the student to reach an intermediate level.

**STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:**

Upon completion of the course students will be able to read with increased vocabulary and comprehension, and with the ability to identify and understand main ideas and author's organization.

**INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:**

Directed readings, small group and class discussions will be the basis of instruction. Also, individualized material will be presented to respond to student needs.

**TIME FRAME:**

RDG 100-3 involves three hours per week for one entire semester.

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**ASSIGNMENTS AND TESTING:**

Weekly assignments will be assessed. Testing will be of a continuous nature. Also, see "Grading" for breakdown of testing.

**EVALUATION METHODS;**

Students will be assessed on the basis of vocabulary tests, comprehension tests, and the ability to understand main ideas. In addition, the students will be assessed on their organization, use of synonyms, etc, and inference.

A final grade will be derived from the following:
