PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

This course will examine the traditional Native family as part of the social system.

Additionally, we will explore the forces that challenge the traditional family. Also, an understanding of basic family structure and issues of families in crisis will be addressed.

STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

After successful completion of this course, the student will have:

- 1. Demonstrated a knowledge of the traditional way of family life.
- 2. Demonstrated a knowledge of contemporary family life and the external and internal forces that challenge it.
- 3. The skill to chart a genogram for an individual or family.
- 4. Developed an awareness of signs of stress in a family.
- 5. Demonstrated a knowledge of helping strategies for families in crisis.

TOPICS:

This course will be divided into three sections:

- 1. Traditional family
- 2. Contemporary family
- 3. Family Crisis

Due to overlap in subject areas, these topics will not always be dealt with in isolated learning units.

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:

Classroom presentations will based on lecture, audio-visuals, guest speakers and group discussions.
