Course Description:	This course introduces students to the Professional Makeup Procedure and teaches fundamental makeup application techniques. All aspects of colour theory, corrective techniques, highlighting and contouring and concealing are explored for basic makeup applications including classic, smokey and pin-up for teens to mature clients. Great emphasis is placed on achieving professional polish for bridal applications. Instruction on brow grooming and shaping is emphasized. Client consultation skills will be developed. Sanitation and disinfection of all tools, and supplies will be discussed and practiced in order to ensure the health and safety of yourself and others.
