Course Description:	This comprehensive course brings together all of the knowledge and skills acquired from Semester I and II. This course will take students through professional client consultation and needs analysis to the provision of a total spa experience with non-therapeutic relaxation body massage, relaxation hot stone massage, cupping massage and a variety of body treatments and hydrotherapy equipment. Students will also be introduced to the application of acrygel, dip powder gel, spray tanning, and LED advanced acne treatment.
