Course Description:	Building on concepts learned in Teaching Methods II, this course focuses on fostering children's understanding of the world through inquiry-based learning. Students will gain teaching strategies to develop play environments and to guide child-initiated and adult-supported experiences that will enhance and deepen learning in indoor, outdoor and beyond spaces. Students also explore fundamental math and science concepts and demonstrate their ability to plan learning experiences that foster learning associated with these subjects for children ages 0-12.
