<b>Course Description:</b>	The Capstone course provides a culminating opportunity for learners to integrate and apply their knowledge of health care administration through the completion of an applied research project. Students will produce a comprehensive project report and deliver a professional poster presentation on a topic relevant to health care leadership. Depending on the project's focus, learners may employ quantitative, qualitative, or mixed-methods research approaches. Throughout the course, students will receive mentorship and structured support to guide them through each stage of the project. In addition to their research work, students will engage in critical self-reflection and evaluate their individual contributions, professional growth, and collaborative competencies.

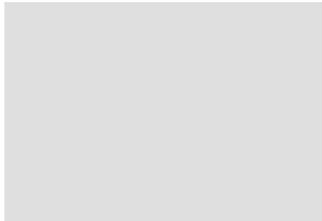
