The topics covered in each of the three (3) tests are as per course outline. The final exam will cover all topics. The three (3) tests are each worth 20% of your final grade. The final exam is worth 40% of your final grade.

The following percentage-letter grade equivalents will be used:

A+ = 93 - 100 % A = 87 - 92 % B = 80 - 86 % C = 70 - 79 % R = Below 70 %

Students may request the deferment of a test for compassionate reasons. NO rewrites will be allowed after the fact for compassionate reasons. Compassionate grounds for deferment include such situations as death of an immediate family member or recent diagnosis of a serious illness of a family member.

"R" grades in any subject at the end of a semester will result in termination from the program. A re-write of any test is a privilege granted at the discretion of the instructor. This decision will be based on your performance, effort, attitude and attendance during the semester. The pass mark on the re-write will be 70%. The best grade you will receive upon passing the re-write will be a "C" grade.

Classroom attendance is compulsory. It is the student's responsibility to advise the instructor of any absenteeism.

You will be given a full week's notice prior to any tests being administered. It is the student's responsibility to advise the instructor in advance if he/she cannot attend a test.
