PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

To introduce students to advanced navigation and instrument procedures, and achieve a standard of morse code reception of six words per minute as required for multi-engine instrument flight operations.

NOTES:

- Morse code will be practiced after first six code periods by a 5-10 minute session during the first Navigation and Instrument Procedure period of each day.
- 2. Actual order of material covered will depend largely on course progress in flying and ground trainer, which is in itself dependent on weather.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):

The student will be assessed by written mid-term and final examinations, with both tests carrying equal weight.

Grades will be indicated as follows:
