COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will study the effects of how and why enployees behave in organizations. The course will focus on the various aspects of groi^) process, group content, team building, conflict resolution and increased self-awareness of the worker's role in an organization.

<u>PURPOSE</u>

- 1) Provide learning at both the theoretical and experiential levels,
- 2) Enable the student to understand group process.
- 3) Develop the student's ability to work in groups as facilitator.
- 4) Develop the student's effectiveness in interpersonal carmunication.
- 5) Enable the student to achieve greater self-awareness.

BEHAVIOUR CBJECTIVES

After completing the course, each student will be able to:

- 1) Observe class group and recount process observations.
- 2) Demonstrate effective use of communication skills
- 3) Identify, label and use group skills appropriately.
- 4) Describe and give examples of the differences between process and content.
- 5) Etemonstrate the ability to problem-solve and make decisions in the group
- 6) Describe the effect that a variety of behaviours has on the group e.g. lateness, absence, participation, conflict.
- 7) Demonstrate and evaluate ability to complete a group task.
- 8) Demonstrate self-awareness in relatice to self and others verbally and in writing,
- 9) Demonstrate acceptance of responsibility for ami learning.

MEIHODODDGY

Traditional lecturing will make up approximately 35% of the course delivery with the remaining 65% utilizing large and small group discussion and groip process simulation activities.
