# PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

This course is designed to provide the student with an introduction to a variety of counselling techniques for use with the developmentally handicapped on an individual and group basis.

- 1. To develop in the learner "self as instrument" concept in working with the handicapped.
- To enable the student to develop specific competencies in counsellin the developmentally handicapped and their parents.
- 3. To enhance the learner's development of a feeling of self worth.
- 4. To improve the learner's ability as an active listener.

# METHOD OF ASSESSMENT (GRADING METHOD):
