COURSE DESCRIPTION

The structure of the Family Dynamics course is designed to separate out what needs to be learned from what needs to be experienced. Students must begin to think in a new way about family behaviour and at the same time, learn how to use themselves as "professionals" in a special way.

Family Dynamics I will deal with understanding family systems theory. The content will emphasize the use of systems theory as a way of organizing knowledge about human behaviour.
