PREREQUISITES

2) Principles and Applications of Learning Theory.

PHILOSOPHY AND GOALS OF COURSE

The various psychopathologies of the child and adolescent will be examined from a holistic perspective - eg. bio-psycho-social paradigm. Each psychopathology will be explored intensively with respect to symptoms, causes, treatment and prevention approaches. Special emphasis will be placed on case formulation and practical intervention strategies.

STUDENT PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of this course the student should be able to:

- review and reintegrate knowledge of normal development patterns from physical, psychological, social and cognitive perspectives.
- demonstrate knowledge of the basic terms in the area of study.
- recognize and explain the signs and symptoms of the major areas of psychopathology in both oral and written formats.
- demonstrate the role of a CYW in relation to intervention and treatment issues through application of case formulation model to case studies.
 - demonstrate an ability to accept others despite their handicaps, disabilities, or mental dysfunction.

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<u>METHODOLOGY</u>

The method of instruction will consist of lectures supplemented by class discussion of major research and/or actual case histories relating to specific areas of study.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Each student or group of students will be assigned task related to a topic area. These tasks are as follows:

- Students will be expected to select and prepare a case study for class discussion.
 Case study is to be prepared following the case formulation principles from Child Care Practice III and guidelines discussed in class.
- 1b. Two supporting references required from the following sources: journals, books, community agency interview, articles from specific magazines (particularly as references relate to treatment).
- Submit a copy of the case, write up and bibliography
- Each student will be assigned to work with a clinical group during class.

There will be two tests, one at mid-term and one final. Dates to be announced in class.

Tests cannot be rewritten in order to obtain a higher grade. Tests may be rescheduled at the instructor's discretion for substantial and substantiated reasons for absence on test day. Any rescheduling will be arranged so that the test is written prior to the next class after the missed test. After that class, missed tests cannot be written. Students who miss a test <u>MUST</u> make rescheduling arrangements directly and immediately with the instructor.

85% attendance is strongly recommended as a minimum requirement as case studies are discussed as well as opportunities to integrate and demonstrate an understanding of course objectives and curricula.
