Purpose of Course:

This course is designed to pick up where Group Dynamics I left off. This will provide opportunities for the students to utilize skills in group process. The focus will be on child and adolescent group behavior, especially in treatment situations. The dynamic aspects of groups (that they are ever changing, ever growing) will be a major theme. The class group will comprise the labratory experience.

Objectives:

- 1. Develop skills in providing leadership to a group.
- 2. Explore the dynamics of group growth and decision making.
- Increase personal competence in group work, particularly with children and adolescents.
- 4. Development of basic skills in counselling with groups.
- Continuation of the process of learning how our own values and behaviours affect the groups we are with.

Learning Resources:

Each student is required to obtain the four volumes of the "Series on Leaders' is and Group Danalognach", by Madley Direck, Montreal: Concordia University Press, 1970. The four volumes are entitled:

1. Factors in Working With Groups

- 2. How to Observe your Group
- 3. How to Analyze and Evaluate Group Growth
- 4. Planning Group Development

In addition, the College will provide various learning resources.
