COURSE DESCRIPTION

The structure of the Family Dynamics course is designed to separate out what needs to be learned from what needs to be experienced. Students must begin to think in a new way about family behaviour and at the same time learn how to use themselves as "professionals" in a special way.

Family Dynamics II is designed to provide greater emphasis on assessing problems childhood and utilizing skills necessary to assist families in trouble. The major concepts to be presented and explored will be: a) family life cycles; b) assessment models; c) prescriptions; d) metaphors; e) sculpting; and f) the remarried family. Also, this term Strategic (or Brief) Family Therapy will receive special attention.

COURSE CONTENT

1. Objectives:

The student will be able to:

- (a) discuss family life cycle concepts
- (b) understand the application of family assessment models
- (c) apply the methods of prescribing, use of metaphors, use of expressive techniques
- (d) discuss issues related to working with the remarried family
- (e) discuss the contemporary use of Strategy Family Therapy

2. Expectations:

The course requirements for Family Dynamics II include:

- (a) read assigned sections of the text
- (b) read any other assigned material
- (c) participate in two group role play, simulating live-interviews with a family
- (d) one examination
