COURSE DESCRIPTION:

RN or RPN, certificate of completion Advanced nursing foot care, current CNO certificate of registration, professional insurance in the amount of \$3 million liability/malpractice (obtained through your nursing association).

A 10 hour workshop to gain practical knowledge and skills including padding and strapping theory and practice, assessing for and fitting shoes and assessing for and creating appliances to address foot problems. A \$15 extra charge per student will follow registration that will be used to cover needed supplies.

RATIONALE:

Opportunities for additional knowledge and the practical application of concepts and skills of advanced footcare in a simulated and actual client setting is essential preparation for the RN and RPN to function within the scope of practice as defined in the Regulated Health Professions Act.

COURSE DELIVERY:

The course content <u>may</u> be presented through a blend of instructional methods, including lecture, Internet, discussion, independent study, audio/video conferencing and videotape.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES/OUTCOMES:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Demonstration of Knowledge of Biomechanics
 <u>Potential Elements of the Performance:</u> demonstrate knowledge of the normal biomechanics of the foot/feet
- 2. Demonstration of Knowledge of Abnormal Biomechanical

 <u>Potential Elements of the Performance</u>: demonstrate knowledge of the
 problems associated with abnormal biomechanical function in the foot/feet
- 3. Preparation of Custom Devices

 <u>Potential Elements of the Performance</u>: prepare a number of custom devices to give temporary relief for conditions including corns, warts, calluses, bunions, overlapping digits, inter-digital corns, metatarsal pain and inflammation
- Prepare and Apply Devices
 <u>Potential Elements of the Performance</u>: prepare and apply a number of
 devices (paddings and strappings) to give temporary relief to conditions
 arising from abnormal foot/feet
- 5. Provide First Aid Management

<u>Potential Elements of the Performance</u>: provide first aid management/care to foot injuries

6. Provide Health Teachings
<u>Potential Elements of the Performance</u>: provide health teaching appropriate to the foot conditions presented

TOPICS

- Anatomy and physiology of the lower leg and foot (review)
- Biomechanics of the lower leg and foot/feet
- Mechanical stresses affecting foot care function
- Indications and contraindications for the application of paddings and strappings
- Making custom made devices and using pre fab devices including interdigital wedge, tubifoam, corn pads and callus pads and wart medications
- Lab practice
