Course Description:	This course builds upon the knowledge and the makeup artistry skills acquired in Makeup Artistry I through participation with a local theatre production. A review of eye brow shaping will be stressed as students will be introduced to microblading techniques. Practical instruction will also include an introduction to lash extensions and lash lifts. Lash and brow enhancements will be emphasized.
