

I. PHILOSOPHY/GOALS:

This course is designed for students with some knowledge of *throwing*. Students will be concentrating on lidded pots, jugs, and dinnerware. Production techniques will be stressed. Kiln loading and firing, glaze preparing, and general care of the studio will be covered.

II. ITEMS TO BE COMPLETED:

- 12 x 1 lb. mugs, finished on wheel.
- 3 of 4 to 5 lb. different style jugs, finished on wheel.
- Make the biggest lidded pot you can make. Also, I would like a complete canister set from each student.
- 6 dinner plates, same size and shape.
