COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will assist students in understanding how different legislative Acts or Bills affect the population they will be serving and the implications for the Developmental Services Worker. Students will be encouraged to express ideas for improving service delivery for the developmentally handicapped.

OBJECTIVES:

After completing this course the student will:

1. Have a knowledgeable understanding of different service delivery models.
2. Distinguish between Schedule I, II, and III facilities for the developmentally handicapped.
3. Gain an understanding of the career fields available for graduating students.
4. Become knowledgeable of the Child & Family Service Act, the Adult Services Act and the Developmental Services Act.
5. Discuss issues related to fieldwork practicum.

METHODOLOGY:

Guest speakers, films, and recent literature will be used to facilitate discussion and learning. This class will also be used to assist students having difficulties with fieldwork and fieldwork assignments. Because of the nature of this course no formal syllabus will be necessary.
