COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This 4-week course will be offered 4 hours a week for a total of 16 hours. It is a continuation of Ed 301-2 Physical Development I which examined pre-natal and post-natal development in the infant to one year of age. This course will examine the development of the young child of 12 months to 30 months of age... the toddler, including: changing physiological needs and functions, locomotion and advances in motor organization, the growing self-concept, independence and autonomy and adaptation to routines and schedules; feelings and emotions and socialization. In addition the following topics will be examined: physiological problems and diseases, symptoms of atypical physical condition and functioning. Pertinent medical terminology, public health and medical procedures and medical recordkeeping will also be discussed.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The students will demonstrate their understanding and knowledge through written tests, in-class discussions and activity programming; of the following areas:

- Changing needs: feeding and growing, sleeping, toilet training, teething, and everyday care.
- 2) How the toddler is using his/her body.
- Thinking and Playing
- 4) Language Learning
- 5) Infectious Diseases, Safety and Diet, and Public Health
- 6) Atypical physical condition and functioning
