This course is designed as an introduction to characteristics of children identified as exceptional and to Special Education in Ontario. Definition and classification; prevalence and etiology; identification; developmental consequences; and appropriate interventions for the various categories of exceptionality will be explored.

OBJECTIVES

To enable the student to demonstrate a basic understanding of:

- 1. the meaning of Special Education in the Province of Ontario.
- 2. the major causes of exceptionality.
- 3. the role and reactions of family (parents and siblings) and professionals (doctors, teachers, other health and education professionals) to the exceptional child.
- 4. the types, the causes of, and the interventions required for children with (i) intellectual differences, (ii) communication disorders, (iii) sensory deficits, (iv) emotional disturbances.
- 5. children with moderate and severe physical and health problems such as spinal bifida, multiple sclerosis and asthma.
- 6. children with multiple handicaps.
- 7. children who are culturally different.
