PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This course provides an opportunity for participants to explore and report on a topic or topics related to adult education. Choice of topic is at the discretion of the learner but must be approved by the tutor before the research begins. Selected readings, completing a research paper and a learning portfolio are the major requirements for this course.

OBJECTIVES

1. The learner will select and research a topic(s) related to adult education.
2. The learner will write a major research paper related to the topic(s) of their choice.
3. The learner will complete a learning portfolio which outlines the learner's life and learning experiences and their effects on his/her professional life.
