It fully integrates learning from both the practice and research arenas, and focuses on the beginning registered nurse as a consumer and future producer of nursing research. In addition to developing differing paradigm perspectives and processes for one nursing practice action, the student examines a selected approach with a critical ethical lens and presents that one study perspective via a professional poster presentation to fellow nursing students and nursing professionals in the community reflective of scholarly efforts.

Through active engagement in systematic and critical inquiry, learners propose a plan to study a specific, current and significant evidence-informed nursing practice topic aimed at providing quality patient care.
