The purpose of this nursing research course is to provide the learner with the opportunity to disseminate one well-developed plan of study on an evidence-informed nursing practice topic of interest. It fully integrates learning from both the practice and research arenas, and focuses on the beginning registered nurse as a consumer and future producer of nursing research. In addition to developing differing paradigm perspectives and processes for one nursing practice action, the student examines a selected approach with a critical ethical lens and presents that one study perspective via a professional poster presentation to fellow nursing students and nursing professionals in the community reflective of scholarly efforts.

This course upholds the nursing research praxis model of delivery introduced in the Year III research courses. Through active engagement in systematic and critical inquiry, learners propose a plan to study a specific, current and significant
